LOCATION OF POSITION:

91ST CIVIL SUPPORT TEAM, PHOENIX, ARIZONA

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is in the Active Guard and Reserve Force and is **open to current members of the Arizona Army/Air National Guard in the ranks of SGT/E-5/SSgt/E-5 and below and those eligible to become members of the Arizona Army National Guard**. Individual selected will receive an Active Duty Title 32 Tour with the Arizona Army National Guard. In order to be considered for this position applicants must meet minimum qualifications as outlined on the reverse of this announcement.

NOTE: Selection for this position requires declaration of Arizona state residency at the time of in-processing, and maintaining that residency while on AGR status under Title 32, USC.

NOTE: Individual without the appropriate MOS/AFSC will be considered regardless of MOS/AFSC.

NOTE: Army individuals who are on their initial tour will not be considered.

NOTE: This announcement will automatically close 31 December 2004.

NATIONAL GUARD REQUIREMENTS:

1. Soldiers selected must meet medical standards prescribed by AR 40-501 chapter 2 or 4, as appropriate, and must have completed a medical examination at an active duty medical facility or MEPS station within 12 months preceding entry into the AGR program. Soldiers must meet the physical requirements of AR 600-9. Females will be tested for pregnancy within 30 days prior to initial entry on active duty.
 2. AGR personnel in other positions are normally not reassigned during the first 18 months of their initial tour, which will be waived upon selection as necessary. Must be MOS qualified within 18 months of date of hire. Selection to the CST will result in a commitment to the unit for a period of 3 years. Promotion potential within the CST will be limited due to the rank structure and extensive training requirements. Failure to meet the additional requirements will result in release from AGR status under the authority of NGR (AR) 600-5, para 6-4, or ANGI 36-101, para 6.5.3.
 3. Position as NBC Team Member will require Secret Clearance. If required, an investigation will be initiated for a security clearance. Unfavorable results will be cause for immediate separation.
 4. Individuals selected for positions with the CST will be on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Due to the nature of the mission of this unit, selectee must reside, or relocate to, within a 1 hour commute of State Headquarters.
 5. The Arizona National Guard is an Equal Opportunity employer. Selection for this position will be based on merit, fitness, capability, and potential, to ensure fair treatment of all soldiers.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION OR THE MOS PREREQUISITES:

1. Possesses or able to obtain qualification in MOS 54B or equivalent AFSC.
2. Possesses PULHES levels not less and 122221.
3. Possesses a minimum score of 95 in the aptitude area of ST (ARMY).
4. Possesses normal color vision.
5. Possesses or able to obtain a Secret Clearance.
6. Does not have current or pending flagging actions.
7. Desired to have J5 Technical Escort designator.
8. Must pass a Level A protective suit adaptability test of 60 minutes, administered by the CST.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION: Sets up and operates state of the art NBC equipment and Toxic Industrial Chemical detection, identification, survey and sample collection equipment. Expected to be proficient in NGB antidote administration, safe patient extraction, and crime scene/evidence preservation techniques. Participates in/monitors CST chain-of-custody (sample transfer) procedures. Follows the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Guide when responding to incidents utilizing the appropriate respiratory protection. Responsible to perform the duties NBC Team Chief in the event the NBC Team Chief is not available during a WMD incident. Job has a physical demands rating of “very heavy”.

Personnel assigned to the Civil Support Team must be able to perform basic HAZMAT Technician duties. This would include:

- a. Wearing personal protective equipment that weighs approximately 50 pounds and carrying monitoring equipment averaging 20 pounds, while performing hazardous materials technician tasks.
- b. Operating in environments of high noise, poor visibility, limited mobility at heights; and in enclosed or confined spaces.
- c. Making rapid transitions from rest to near-maximal exertion without warm-up periods.
- d. Requiring the member to work for long periods of time, requiring sustained physical activity and intense concentration.
- e. Performing a variety of tasks on slippery, hazardous surfaces.
- f. Wearing fully encapsulated level A suit for at least one hour.
