ORGANIZATIONAL MAINTENANCE SHOP #6 (OMS #6), BELLEMONT, ARIZONA

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is the Federal/Excepted Civil Service and is open to current onboard Technicians assigned to OMS #6 who are members of the Arizona Army National Guard. Individual selected will receive the appropriate Temporary Action NTE 1 year or upon return of the incumbent and may be extended if the incumbent's mobilization is extended. Acceptance of a Federal Excepted technician position of over 179 days in length will cause termination from the Selected Reserve Incentive Program (BONUS). Individual selected will be required to take a pre-employment medical screening which will be paid for by the Agency. **PCS funds are not authorized.**

NOTE: Individual selected must possess a valid state drivers license and ability to obtain a U.S. Government operators license.

NATIONAL GUARD REQUIREMENTS: Excepted employees must wear the uniform prescribed by the Adjutant General. Acceptance of the position constitutes concurrence with this requirement. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED FOR SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE IN THIS POSITION:

1. Skilled in the use of diagnostic and test equipment to determine problems in electrical, hydraulic and engine systems.
2. Ability to read and interpret technical manuals, work orders, schematics and layouts for gasoline and diesel engines and other related systems.
3. Knowledge and ability to use hand and power tools associated with vehicle repair.
4. Technical knowledge necessary to troubleshoot, repair and overhaul heavy mobile systems and vehicles to include tracked vehicles if appropriate.
5. Ability to identify and order repair parts from parts manuals.
6. Knowledgeable in the workflow process for supported units.
7. Able to inspect and identify faults on most military supported equipment.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: Each applicant must fully substantiate on their application how they meet the requirements listed below in the Specialized Experience area; otherwise applicant will be considered unqualified for this position.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Must have 15 months experience in repairing, rebuilding and overhauling systems and major components of heavy mobile equipment; experience in diagnosing malfunctions and determining remedy where complex relationships exist among different mechanical systems, requiring knowledge of units and systems with possible damage to equipment if incorrectly handled; experience in making mechanical repairs that required the use of precision measuring equipment and common hand tools; examples of tools used are micrometers, vernier calipers, dial indicators, wrenches and screwdrivers; experience in using diagnostic and testing equipment such as digital multimeters and engine analyzers; experience which demonstrates the ability to interpret technical manuals, specifications, and publications.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION: This position is located in an Organizational Maintenance Shop. Its purpose is to perform organizational and limited direct support maintenance, repair, and inspection on equipment supported by the facility. Troubleshoots and performs organizational and limited direct support maintenance and repair on heavy duty mobile equipment and vehicles such as road graders, conveyors, bulldozers, power shovels, heavy duty compressors, large generators, tractors, tanks, tracked combat vehicles, cranes, and accessory equipment. Services and makes necessary repairs including removing and replacing new or rebuilt assemblies such as voltage regulators, generators, brake cylinders, etc., and removing and cleaning fuel tanks and injectors. Performs operational inspection and insures vehicles and equipment are properly serviced, to include brake adjustments, replacing hydraulic fluids, greasing, cleaning, and other preventive maintenance operations required. Applies modifications to equipment according to Modification Work Orders (MWO). Maintains and repairs multi-purpose generators, heating and air conditioning units, compressors, and pumps. Performs repairs such as replacing engine heads, head gaskets, wheel seals, and seals in major components such as transmissions, transfers, and differentials. Performs organizational and limited direct support maintenance. Performs inspections on vehicles and associated equipment supported by the activity, ranging from shop acceptance to final inspection. Operates equipment prior to issue to units for use during Inactive Duty Training (IDT) and Annual Training (AT), to assure that it is operating properly. May perform organizational and limited direct support maintenance on automotive, communication-electronic, and small arms equipment, and make minor body and fender or metal case repairs using peening hammers, welding equipment, and paint spray equipment.
